4. Trustee's Report. (Review of last year's activities and plans for 2025)

Charitable Objectives stated.

Membership 2024 -123 a decline on 2023 from 149, levels returned to pre-covid,

Nationally decline is 5%

Income roughly as before due to increase in membership

Training numbers are down though more training on sailing being done.

Sailing – had 15 races and several cruises, 60 clients on try-out day.

Kayaking & Paddle Boarding – now Paddle UK club. Ran family paddle fun day, time trials and trips away from the bay.

Killington – club nights were held at Killington June-September with 20-25 members per session.

Restoration of Severn – recently received £40,000 from 2 trusts toward the cost of completing the restoration. Hope the boat will be on the water in 2025.

Will be obtaining an insurance valuation.

Held several regattas and a singing festival.

Schools & Youth – try out days for 4 schools, 2 Youth Groups and had 157 participants overall.

Clubhouse – held several musical events over the year as well as private hire of clubhouse. Revenue down on clubhouse. Committee are actively promoting the clubhouse for the coming year.

Plans for 2025 - Introducing an Assistant Instructors Scheme – to help older teenagers and give them life experience. Assistants will aid professional instructors

Hope to get involved with RYA Youth Racing Pathway – to join with Coniston SC

Set up sailing Buddy scheme – to allow less experienced sailors the chance to sail.

Dutyman app – to organise volunteers.

Bursary Scheme – have funding available for a Trust to assist with families on low income.

Sailing pathway was shown for Adult and Youth

Paddle Boarding & Kayaking – hoping to offer several paddling events throughout the year.

Paddle Leader volunteer – hoping to train up 2 volunteers to do this Paddle Pathway was shown.

Details of possible clubhouse events shown.

5. Accounts

AD went through the accounts for both Sailing Club and Clubhouse.

Sailing Club - Overall income slightly down from 2022-23, showing a deficit of £2,651 for 2024-25

Old Customs House – income down from previous year. Gross profit down by £4000 Members gueried elements on accounts and AD answered.

Training income is lower than cost of employing person to run courses, If wish to adhere to our objectives to offer sailing to wider, disadvantaged people need to offer training or will not attract members.

- Boats: under 18 feet £35, Boats 18 feet or over £50,
- Kayak £15
